Joshua's academic achievements include induction into the National Honor Society as a sophomore, earning Honor Roll status each semester, he will have taken 11 AP classes through his senior year plus calculus III, he has taken and passed 6 AP tests through his junior year, and he scored 1550 on his SAT. He was awarded the AP Scholar with Distinction and he holds a 5.07 GPA.

Save the Date! Parent University for January 2023 is Coming!



2023 SAT Preparation Class

Bulldogs Test Better

Grant has again partnered with Mrs. Sandy Martinez to teach Grant's 2023 SAT Prep Class. Mrs. Martinez is an Associate Professor from the College of Lake County and is a veteran test prep teacher with years of experience working with various test preparation companies in multiple area high schools. The curriculum we follow utilizes the College Board's Official SAT Study Guide. Utilizing a combination of teacher-led instruction, strategy and content acquisition, and individual practice the course is designed to provide students the resources, structure, and content instruction to be successful on the SAT.

Why SAT?

The SAT is the most widely accepted college entrance exam. Additionally, the State of Illinois has adopted the SAT as a graduation requirement.

April 12, 2023 is the State-wide required SAT administration date in which all juniors take the SAT.

The Logistics

Class is open to all currently enrolled Grant juniors. Four class times are available Monday evenings 5:00 pm - 8:00 pm, Tuesday evenings 5:00 pm - 8:00 pm, Sunday mornings 9:00 am - 12:00 pm, & Sunday afternoons 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm. Depending on interest, we will be offering a spring break session. The same 21 hours of instruction will be concentrated into 5 days. Sessions will be held daily starting on Monday, March 27 and ending on Friday, March 31, from 9:00 am—1:15 pm. All classes will be held virtually via Zoom.

The cost for this seven - week class is \$80 and includes one copy of "The Official SAT Study Guide" as well as custom, additional practice and instructional materials.

Payments can be made online through Revtrak. Payment cannot be put on student obligations. Students eligible for free & reduced lunch or who may need financial assistance should see their school counselor to waive fees.

Enrollment

Enrollment begins on January 5 and closes on February 3.
Enrollment is limited and will be on a first come basis.
Students are automatically enrolled in the course once payment is accepted via Reytrak.
